SON OF THE WHITE MARE

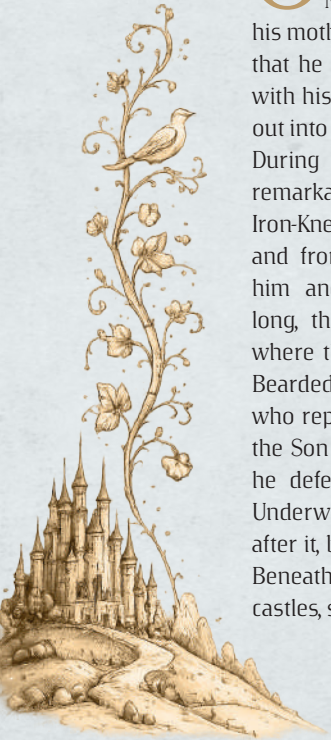
